Their desire to play constructive rugby make Bedford an attraction even to the luke-warm supporters and last Saturday they gained a commendable victory over Richmond by 17 points to 8.

Last season, on October 2nd, Gloucester accounted for Bedford on their own ground by 11 points to 8. Nick Foice and Peter Ford scored tries, Don Rutherford converting one and landing a penalty goal.

Bedford visited Kingsholm in 1964 – Gloucester winning 19 pts. to 9.

The lucky number programme for the Moseley game was held by Mr. L. Banting, 25 Hurcombe Way, Brockworth ; Mr. R. Stafford, 2 Foxwell Drive, Hucclecote, with programme number 791 for the Wolfhounds match, was also lucky. They each won £5.

No guarantee can be given at this stage on the number of tickets that will be available, for it depends on the allocations made to the Club.

So roll up and make your applications soon, chaps ; its in your own interests. Please don’t toddle along and ask if there’s a ticket going on the evening before the match !

The dates are : January 14th – Western Counties v. Australians.
Internationals – January 7th – England v. Australians ; February 25th – England v. France ; March 18th – England v. Scotland.

Tickets for the Western Counties’ match are : Main Stand £1 ; Temporary Stand 15/- ; Ringside 10/- ; Enclosure 7/6 ; Ground 5/-
Scholars 2/6.

Prices for all International matches (inclusive of booking fee) are ; Stand 31/- ; Ringside 10/6 ; Enclosure 6/6 ; Ground 5/-.

The matches at Twickenham are the only ones for which the Club Secretary can obtain tickets, which are solely for the use of Gloucester R.F.C. members. There is no allocation of tickets for the away matches against Ireland and Wales.

The Secretary will not accept enquiries re tickets, etc. at his home or business.
